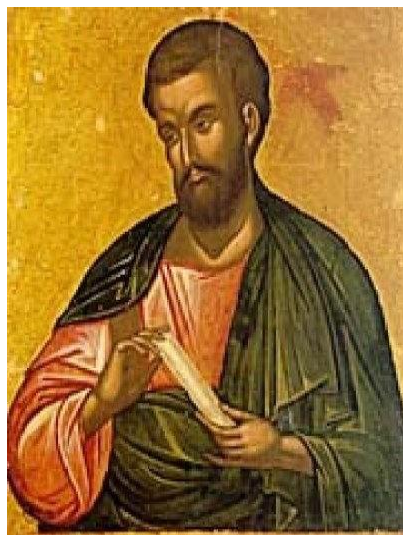

Saint Bartholomew

Bartholomew, known in some Gospels as Nathanael, a name that means “God has given” was introduced to Jesus by the apostle Philip with the description that Jesus was the promised one of God. Upon learning where Jesus was born, Bartholomew asked, “Can anything good come out of Nazareth?” But, the moment Jesus saw Bartholomew, Jesus praised him, saying that he could see there was no dishonesty in his heart. Bartholomew immediately believed in Jesus becoming an Apostle and witness to many of Jesus’ beautiful miracles.

Two lessons of note – First, Nathanael’s comment about Nazareth highlights God’s freedom and ability to be found in the very places where we least expect Him. We must be ready and willing at all times; open always for His message. Second, Bartholomew believed and followed Jesus. Jesus knew this revelation was from God the Father. We are confident He knows each of us intimately, knows our heart. But to have a

relationship with Jesus, we must believe and act on those beliefs – Faith!

Bartholomew traveled to foreign lands to share the Good News, founding Christian communities in India, Armenia and Turkey. He was martyred by a death of flaying, which is thought to be the reason he is the patron saint of leatherworks, tanning, butchers – all associated with skin.

Closing Prayer:

Lord, open my mind and heart to the treasure of Your Truth as revealed in the Doctrine of the Real Presence. Grant that my eyes may see, through faith’s vision, the wonders of Your Love in the Most Holy Eucharist. As I meditate on the mystery of Your Hidden Presence, I entreat You to increase my faith, enkindle my hope, and depen my love for You, my Eucharistic King. Amen

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today we continue to read from the Gospel according to Mark. For the past three Sundays, we have been hearing Mark’s reports of conversations between Jesus and his disciples. Recall that in Mark’s Gospel, Jesus uses these private moments to teach his disciples in greater detail about the Kingdom of God. Beginning with today’s Gospel, Jesus returns to Judea, Jewish territory, and resumes his public ministry. The first verse of chapter 10 of Mark’s Gospel tells us that crowds gathered around Jesus, and he taught them, as was his custom. Immediately, the Pharisees approach Jesus to test him. The Pharisees question Jesus about the lawfulness of divorce. Under specific conditions, divorce was an accepted practice among the Jewish people during the time of Jesus. It was regulated by the Law of Moses, as found in Deuteronomy 24:1-5. This law only permits that a husband may divorce his wife if he finds her to be indecent. This is the justification that the Pharisees reference when Jesus inquires about the commandment of Moses. In reply, Jesus quotes from the Book of Genesis and counters that God’s original intention was that men and women would become one flesh in marriage. Jesus describes the teaching of Moses as a concession made to God’s original intention because of human stubbornness. In private, Jesus’ disciples question him further about this teaching on divorce. It is to his disciples that Jesus lays out the implications of his teaching by explaining that remarriage after di- vorce is adultery. Jesus’ teaching was more restrictive than the teaching of the Pharisees, which permitted remarriage. Jesus further distinguished his teaching from the cultural norms of his time by applying his words equally to men and women. Jewish culture per- mitted only that a husband may divorce his wife.

Wives were not permitted to divorce their husband for any reason, including adul- tery.

At first glance, the final part of today’s Gospel seems unconnected to the previous teaching about divorce. When read together, however, these passages present a strong picture of Jesus’ emphasis on the importance of family. God intended for women and men to be joined together in marriage. Among the purposes of marriage is the raising of children. By welcoming children and fostering their relationship with God, parents and families bear witness to the Kingdom of God.
