Our Lady of Lourdes 1621 Club was established over 50 years ago to provide additional financial support to our Parish. It is so named because it is the street number of the Church. The Club meets on the first Saturday of each month at 9:00 in the Church rectory. Attendance at the meeting is not required. The only requirement for membership is to have the dues, which are \$12.00 per year per membership, current.
