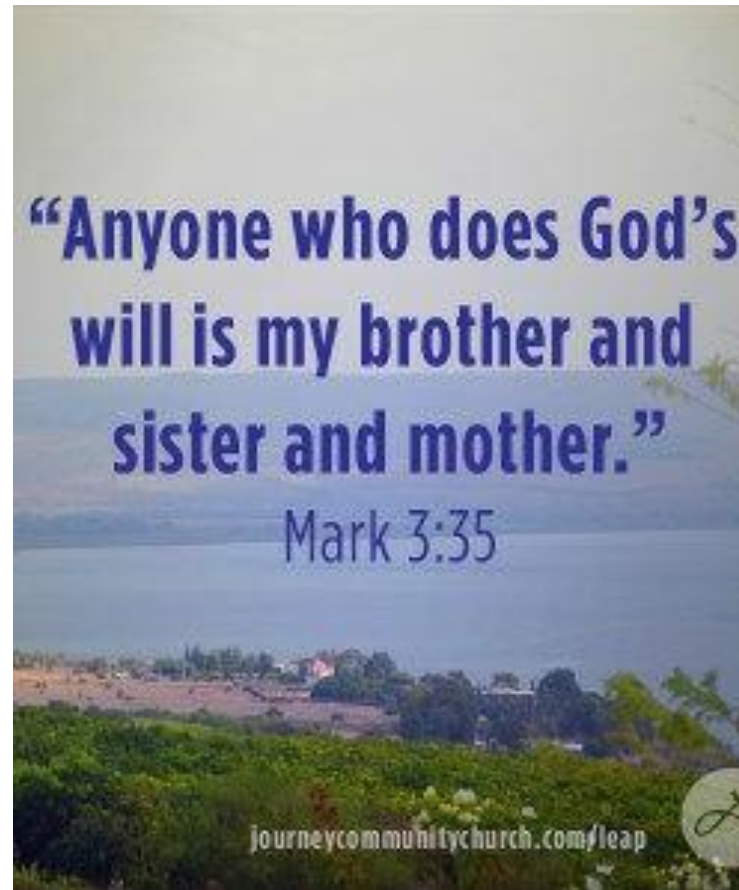

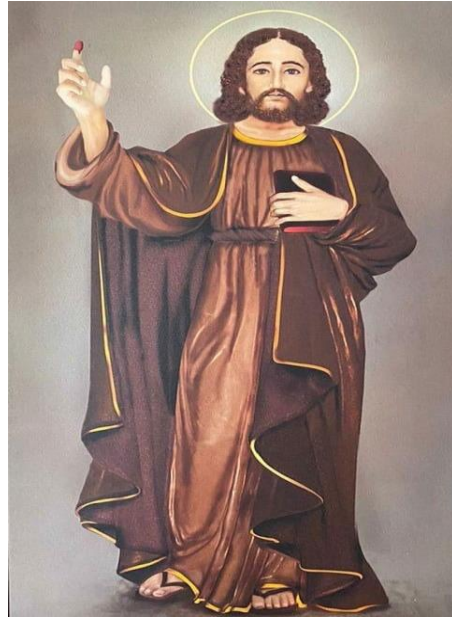

St. Thomas



St. Thomas was a Jew known as both a dedicated and impetuous follower of Christ. When Jesus said He was returning to Judea to visit His sick friend Lazarus, Thomas immediately encouraged the other Apostles to accompany Him; knowing the trip involved both danger and possible death from mounting hostile authorities. At the Last Supper, Christ told His Apostles that He would leave them to prepare a place where they also might come. Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received - for all – the assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of Jesus. Not believing the other Apostles' claims to have seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday, he earned the title, "doubting Thomas." Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas saw Jesus and believed - putting his fingers in the place of the nails and his hand into His side. St. Thomas exclaimed: "My Lord and My God." His was the first public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus.

Like many of the Apostles, St. Thomas was the first missionary to India. He is recognized as the founder of the Church of the Syrian Malabar Christians, or St. Thomas Christians. He landed in Muziris (Cranganore) on the Kerala coast in AD 52 and was martyred in Mylapore, near Madras, Tamil Nadu in AD 72. His feast day is July 3 rd .

Closing Prayer:

Lord, open my mind and heart to the treasure of Your Truth as revealed in the Doctrine of the Real Presence. Grant that my eyes may see, through faith's vision, the wonders of Your Love in the Most Holy Eucharist. As I meditate on the mystery of Your Hidden Presence, I entreat You to increase my faith, enkindle my hope, and deepen my love for You, my Eucharistic King. Amen

GOSPEL REFLECTION

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family.

A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him.

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit.

Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Eucharistic Revival which has been going on for about a year will reach its pinnacle with the Blessed Sacrament being processed across the county on 4 different routes that all culminate in Indianapolis (where the Eucharist Congress is scheduled to be held in July).

Our Archdiocese of Mobile is on the Juan Diego Route.

At 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 15, Archbishop Rodi will celebrate Mass in the Cathedral- Basilica of the Immaculate Conception. At this Mass he will consecrate the host which will be used for our portion of the Eucharistic Procession. The procession will begin as we recess from Mass. It will end at St. Mary Parish Church with a talk about the connection between being people of the Eucharist and being people of service.

After this talk, most pilgrims will be dismissed. (With the exception of those who have volunteered to help stuff bags for distribution to seafarers; materials are provided). There will be a shuttle available to return pilgrims to their cars that were left at the Cathedral
